11th GENERAL ASSEMBLY 15th November 2008 in Brussels

In the **President's Column** on page 2, **SR Michael Kalmár** explains the need for a General Assembly to confirm the changes made to the Statutes and Bye-laws approved by Members at the 10th General Assembly in November 2007 in Luxembourg.

It seems there has been a change in Belgian Law which requires that a Notary is present when the changes to Statutes are made. This is an additional level of administration the Board could do without but the law must be respected. All Effective Members are asked to co-operate and send a representative to the Assembly in Brussels or to advise the Board of a Proxy who can vote on their behalf. All Members have been advised of this development and an Agenda is being sent to them.

The Assembly will have to vote on exactly the same proposals as in Luxembourg but in the presence of a Notary and the changes will have to be approved by the Belgian King.

The **EDA Board** last met in Rome 13 - 15 June 2008 and will meet again in Berlin 4 - 5 October 2008. **EDA Members** have been sent a communiqué with information on matters arising from the Board Meeting in Rome.

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SR Michael Kalmár President's Column

The Final Step is the most difficult one ...

A few years ago when the Board of Directors started the work on the **New Statutes** of the **European Dyslexia Association** we did not foresee the many challenges we had to face.

Whilst making all the changes and creating the new regulations we have spent a lot of time in discussion, first in the Board, and then in consultation with our member organisations. When a consensus was reached, we were glad (and proud) to present it to the 10th General Assembly held in Luxembourg on 15th November 2007.

That General Assembly unanimously accepted the English Translation of the New Statutes (the original had to be in French – following the legal rules in Belgium).

But, when we presented the French original to our legal adviser in Belgium to take the necessary final steps, the Board learned that a new Belgium law which regulates International Charities calls for more steps.

The envisaged amendments must form the subject of an 'authentic deed' prepared, supervised and carried out by a Notary. Moreover, the amendment in relation to the objects or the activities must be approved by the Belgian King. Finally, a number of the envisaged amendments must be brought to the attention of third parties by filing them into the records held at the Court Registry of the Commercial Court and by publishing them in the annexes to *le Moniteur Belge* (the Belgian State Gazette).

Therefore, a further **General Meeting in the presence of a Notary** has to take place.

The Board plans to hold this **General Assembly on November 15**th **2008 in Brussels**. Your organisation has already been officially invited for this final step to complete the requirements.

Please note that the General Assembly can not validly be held unless **two-thirds** of the **Effective Members** are present or represented. The proxies for members who wish to be represented at this meeting do not have to be drawn up in the form of an authentic deed. Nevertheless, Article 8 of the Articles of Association provides that **the proxy-holder must be an Effective Member and that each Effective Member is only entitled to hold two proxies.**

To prepare the legal requirements <u>we urgently need from each Effective Member</u> organisation a <u>Corporate Name</u> (in the local language <u>and</u> in English), in legal form, <u>the address of the Registered/official Office</u> (we have not got all of them in our records!) and <u>a copy of their identification/founding document.</u>

IF I DO NOT RECEIVE THESE DOCUMENTS FROM ALL OF THE EFFECTIVE MEMBERS BY 10TH OCTOBER 2008, I WILL BE FORCED TO POSTPONE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

So the representation of your organisation, present or represented by Proxy, at that General Assembly is needed to keep the EDA legally alive!

7th International Conference

27th - 29th March 2008

'Making Links'

(as extracted from a report in the BDA's journal DYSLEXIA CONTACT for May/June 2008)

Under the experienced Conference Chair, **Prof. Maggie Snowling**, the 7th BDA International Conference was attended by 750 delegates from across the world, from as far away places as Brazil, India, Japan, Peru and Russia – and was deemed a great success.

There were 15 eminent keynote speakers on research into dyslexia and its causes with 65 research papers, 12 symposia, 24 workshops and 86 interactive poster presentations. There were also 33 exhibition stalls covering a wide variety of products. The Mayor of Harrogate welcomed the Delegates to the Conference to a champagne reception on the first evening, followed by a *Bollywood* film about an Indian boy with dyslexia. The Conference Dinner was held on the Friday evening at the Majestic Hotel with keynote speaker **Aryan Van de Leij** (Netherlands) providing an entertaining and 'musical' after dinner speech.

There were many excellent speeches from the keynotes and other presenters and many comments can be found in the BDA's journal *Dyslexia Contact* for May/June 2008. One point not so often emphasised to Local Education Authorities that struck the *EDA NEWS Editors* was made by Prof.Barbara Foorman (USA) in her keynote speech: that 3 – 5 year old children with specific reading problems find it very hard to catch up without specific recognition of their problem and intervention.

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Education Authorities should be told this over and over again until they act to help this age group and so avoid many of the problems that usually arise later.

Activities for Successful Spelling

The essential guide

by Philomena Ott

Although this book was written as a companion to *How to Manage Spelling Successfully*, it may be used independently. It is a practical resource, designed to help students develop an understanding of spelling. The materials cover phonics, syllables, plurals, homophones, root words, prefixes and suffixes. It has a structured, sequential and cumulative approach and the activities use multi-sensory learning to suit different learning styles. A 'Synthetic Phonics Diagnostic and attainment Test' is included to identify a starting point for teaching, setting targets and measuring progress.
